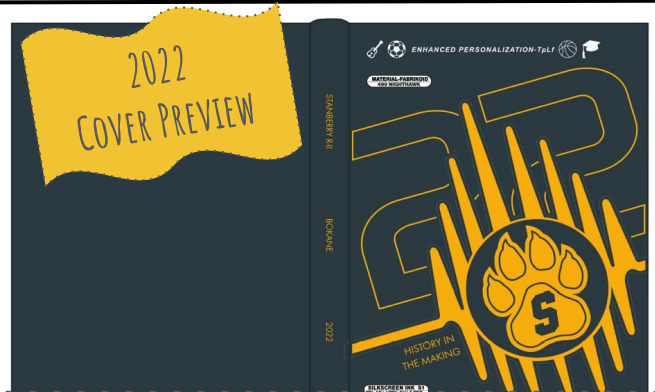


Fourth Grade Moves Up to Intermediate Wing

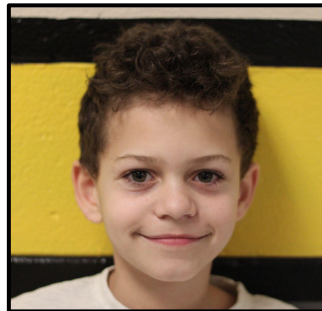
