



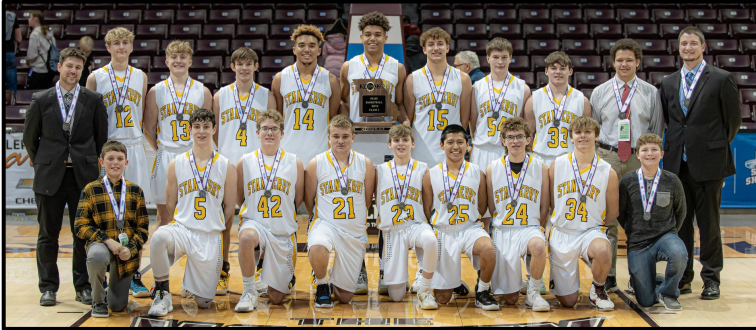

The Bulldog teams ended their season with very successful outcomes. The girls' basketball team made it to the district championship game before falling short to St. Joseph Christian. The girls put up a huge fight the entire game, never letting it get out of their reach. The girls team, overall, had a successful season placing second in the Albany tournament, and first in the King City tournament.

The boys' basketball team surpassed all expectations this year. They made it to the Class 1 Final Four. Senior Austin Schwebach said, "It was a great season. The team also won the Albany tournament, King City Tournament, and the District 15 championship. They also had to win the sectional and quarter final games to get to state.

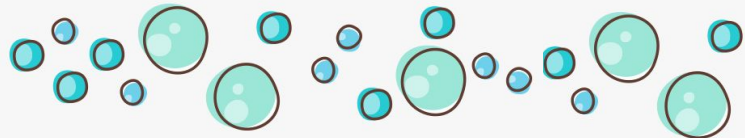
Tuesday, March 1st was an amazing day for the elementary students. All students kindergarten through sixth grade have been working so hard, they need some kind of reward.

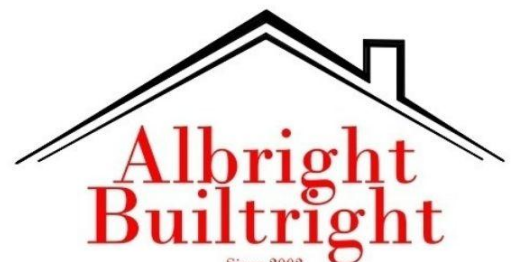

Students Vote on Fun Staff Awards

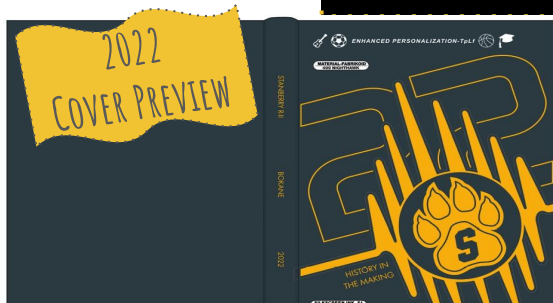
