Book Review

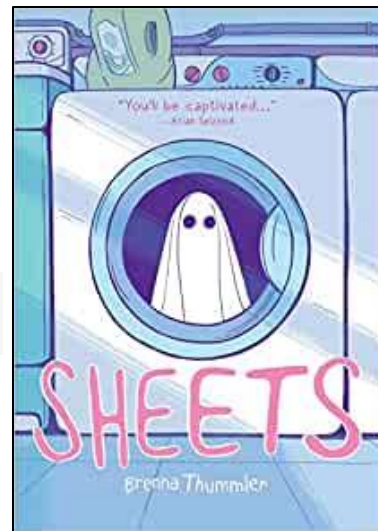

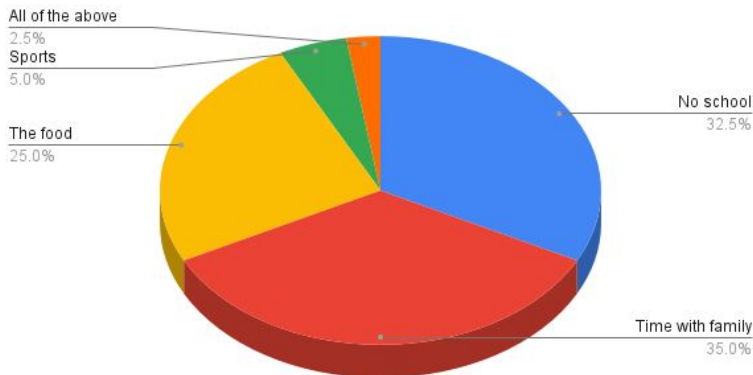

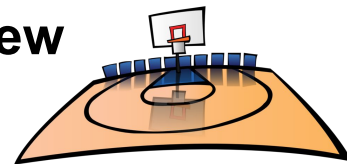
