For the first round, Stanberry girls played at Stanberry vs. North Nodaway,

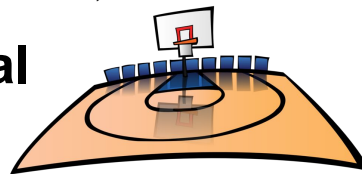

Video Game Review: Noita

Noita is a captivating and innovative roguelike game that stands out in my game library. Developed by Nolla Games, it's a unique blend of pixel art and physics-based gameplay. The game's defining feature is its procedurally generated world, where no two playthroughs are the same, leading to its dynamic and unpredictable interactions.

Players control a wizard, exploring a vast underground realm filled with dangerous creatures and hazards. The freedom to experiment with various spells and wands, combined with the reactive environment, creates an exciting and often chaotic experience. The Perma-death mechanic adds tension (Perma-Death means you can't respawn in the same world). The attention to detail in Noita is commendable, with stunning visuals and atmospheric sound design all contributing to the game's difficulty curve is

challenging, but rewarding, encouraging players to learn and adapt from their mistakes.

While Noita may not be everyone's forte due to its unforgiving nature and pixelated graphics, it does cater to those searching for a fresh take on the roguelike genre. Its physics-based approach and emergent gameplay make it a standout title for those who enjoy experimenting with magic in a perilous and ever-changing world.

This month the movie review is over *The Boys In The Boat*. This movie is based on a true story and was originally a book before being made into a movie this year. The story takes place in 1936 during the Great Depression.

During this time, tryouts were held for the U.S. boating team. Many of the people that tried out were young men struggling during the Great Depression and needed a job. They wanted to try out for the team because, not only would they get paid, but they would also be given a place to stay. After tryouts were completed and the boating team was chosen, practices started to prepare these young men. During these practices, they put in lots of hard work, time and dedication. For example, they had to try many different seating arrangements on the boats until they finally found which arrangement worked best for them. After practicing for some time, competitions began. The team competed in a total of 7 races before making it to the Olympics. Once they made it to the Olympics, (held in Berlin, Germany) they competed against fourteen other teams from different

countries. When the race started, the team stayed towards the back keeping a steady pace. At the halfway mark, they finally kicked into gear. Next thing you know, they are passing everyone and are in the top three. Then, they make it to second and are neck and neck with Germany in the final stretch. After some time, they take the lead, and reach the finish line. The United States rowing team won the 1936 Olympics.

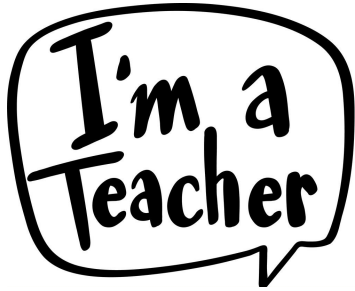
