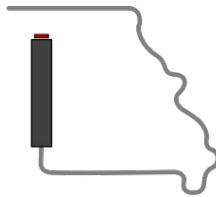

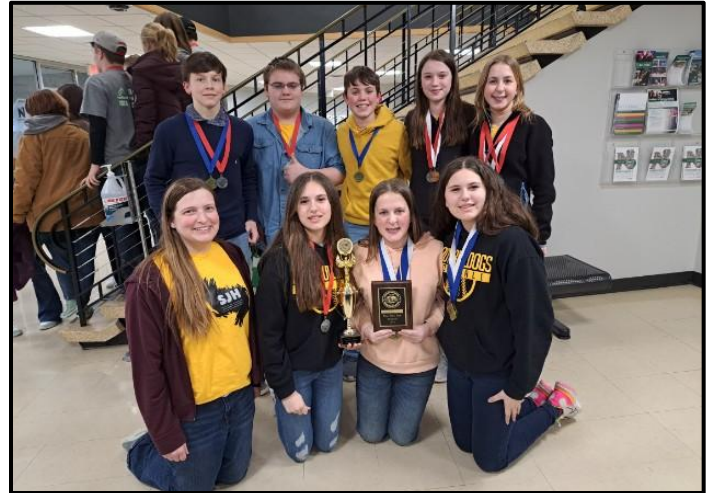

The high school team got 5th place overall, which means only the 1st

place events will be going to state. Rhona's incredibly excited to "get the chance to compete at the state level. I hope everyone else going to state does well in their events." 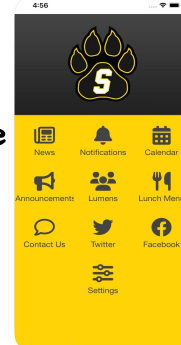

This month we are looking back on the history of track. There has been a wide variety of great accomplishments here at Stanberry R-II, and there are many more to come throughout the years.

Our high school math teacher, Mr. Jason Dias was a participant in the Stanberry track. He participated in shot put, discus, 4x100 and 4x200 relays. He went to state in his sophomore (1998) and junior (1999) year and medaled in each of those events. His senior year (2000) he only participated in shot put and discus and went to state for shot put, and the boys' team took 4th place overall at the state meet.

Mr. Dias stated they had four different track coaches in high school. "I enjoyed competing. We had a great track team and were very successful. It's fun watching Stanberry athletes perform well in their events."

Junior high history teacher Mr. Nick Groomer also participated in high school track and holds multiple records. He had participated in track all four years of high school. Freshman year (1998) he finished second in the 2 mile at state, sophomore year (1999) he also finished second in the 2 mile, but also was on the 4x800 team that finished fourth in state. As a junior (2000) he finished third in the 2 mile at state, fifth in the mile, and the 4x800 team finished second. Senior year (2001) he finished third in the mile and his 4x800 team won state. As a junior the boys' track team placed 4th overall at state. He holds the school records for the mile, 2 mile, and his 4x800 team holds the record. "I loved track; I have so many memories from track meets. I met many friends from other schools and helped our team place in state. Track is a very unique sport that allows athletes to show different skills than other sports."

Track is starting up and they have their first meet March 23rd. We wish everyone the best of luck on a great season.

mountains in the background.

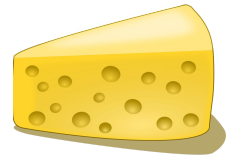

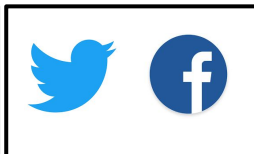
