1st grade has been full of educational fun-filled. activities. The teachers are Mrs. Mackenzie Shifflett and Mrs. Danielle Worley. Mrs. Shifflett's class has students, including Colt Boone, Ella Bower, Bryan Brooke, Correna Gibson, Kacey Luke, Gunnar Maudlin, Heidi McClurg, Lexianne Newman, Paisley Newman, Tate Sager, Brentlee Thomas, Haizlee Ward, Mackenzie Willets, and Isabella Wilmes. Mrs. Worley's class also has 16 students, including Payden Butler, Cooper Lemons, Amelia Luke, Ethan Luke, Peyton Luke, **Beckett** McMillen, Kourtney Meyer,

In math, students have been adding and subtracting within 20, as well as learning new strategies to help with fact fluency. They have reviewed all letter sounds and learned how to read and write words with all of the short vowel sounds in phonics. They're also learning several different spelling rules that go along with short vowels to help read and write words. In reading, the kids have learned about story

elements, including character, setting, problem, solution, and sequencing. This quarter, they are really diving into non-fiction texts. The children learn about daily sky patterns and how sound is created in science. During social studies, they talk about important US symbols and will soon be moving on to learning about winter holidays celebrated around the world.

Mrs. Worley commented, "This is a fun group of students to work with, and I am very proud to see how much learning they have accomplished already this year!" Mrs. Shifflett and Mrs. Worley are also teaching their students skills that will help them in the real world, such as how to win or lose, memorizing classmates' birthdays, saying thank you, excuse me, and please!

Mrs. Mackenzie Shifflett said, "It's been so fun watching this group learn and grow! They are all so eager to learn new things-That's a teacher's dream!"

Altogether, Stanberry FCCLA had a great, educational day.




