

### **Sensational Summer Olympics**

This summer, the 2024 Olympics took place in Paris. It started July 26, 2024. There were over 5,000 medals given at the Olympics this year and over 400 events. Among those, were Simone Biles, Noah Lyles, and Torri Huske. Team USA had the overall medal chart with 126 medals (40 gold, 44 silver, and 42 bronze).

Stanberry R-II students were asked if they watched the Olympics and, if so, what their favorite event of the Olympics was. Decker Heyde replied with, "a 4x4 prelims running event." Paige Campbell's response was, "The Australian break dancers."

A few of the major headlines coming out of the Olympics for the United States was Simone Biles winning the women's gymnastics gold medal, claiming her second Olympics all-around title on August 9, 2024. She came back from taking a break from the 2020 Olympics because she was overwhelmed with all the pressure on her as a world class athlete. Simone bounced back and won a gold medal in the 2024 Olympics.

Next up is Noah Lyles.



Lyles is a three time gold medal winner at the Olympics in the 4x100 meter running event, with a final time of 9.79. Lyles also finished 3rd in the Olympics for the 200 meter. He beat his personal best time with 9.789 seconds which pushed him to a world class field full of elite sprinters.

One of the final major highlights was Torri Huske. Huske went from missing the 100 meter butterfly podium by 0.01 seconds in the 2020 Olympics, to winning three gold medals in the 2024 Olympics. Her time in the butterfly was 55.59; Huske was just flying past her teammates and the world records. Huske beat the world record by 0.04 seconds in the 2024 Olympics.

In the 2024 Olympics they added breaking and kayak cross. Karate was unfortunately dropped and baseball and softball didn't compete, but will be back.

Congratulations to all the medal winners at the 2024 Olympics!

### PUBLIC NOTICE

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, children who live outside the district but are attending a private school within the district, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, children who are wards of the state, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The **Stanberry R-II School District** assures that it will provide a free, appropriate public education (FAPE) to all eligible children with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21 under its jurisdiction. Disabilities include autism, deaf/blindness, emotional disorders, hearing impairment and deafness, intellectual disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment/blindness and young child with a developmental delay.

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The Stanberry R-II School District assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The **Stanberry R-II School District** has developed a Local Compliance Plan for the implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA). This plan may be reviewed during regular business hours from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday when school is in session.

This notice will be provided in native languages as appropriate.





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

### **High School Football**





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

Dear Parent,

The U.S. Congress has passed education legislation entitled "No Child Left Behind." One of the requirements of this legislation is parent notification if a class is going to be taught by someone other than a highly qualified (fully-certified) for four weeks or more.

This notification would apply if a long-term substitute teacher who is not fully certified for the assignment, even though that person does hold a state-issued certificate to substitute teach,

were assigned to cover a class. This would also apply if the school district were waiting on issuance of a teaching certificate or renewal of a certificate from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Technically the teacher has the credentials, but the process of issuing the certificate could take longer than four weeks.

At this time, the teachers of the Stanberry R-II School District all hold valid certificates, and we do not anticipate any longer term substitute situations. We are fulfilling the requirements of No Child Left Behind by issuing this notice. We are very proud of all our staff members, and we can assure you that your child is receiving a quality education.
